ACTIVITY: PICTURE CHANGE

This activity invites students to **consider** how **small positive actions** in their school or community can have a **huge impact** on others.

Wondering

Read the opening page of the book introducing the 12 children. Invite students to **pick one child's story** which they would like to explore further.

Exploring

Read the text with students and follow up by inviting them to **share their wonderings**. Take the time to look at the detail in the illustration. Together explore their wonderings, perhaps they can add new ideas of ways to help.



Invite students to share a way they could help those around them.

Use the question stem, 'We're helping our class, school or community by...' In groups of three students write out their statement, draw a setting and add in specific ways they can help others.
