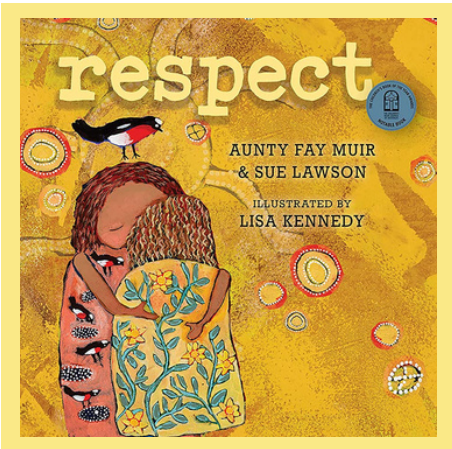


# Respect

## ACTIVITY: GALLERY OF CONNECTIONS

### Connect

Invite students to respond to the following questions.

- What questions do you have?

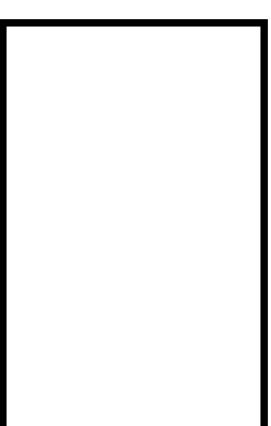
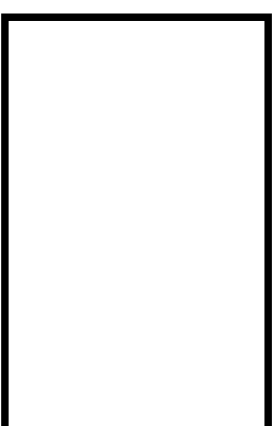
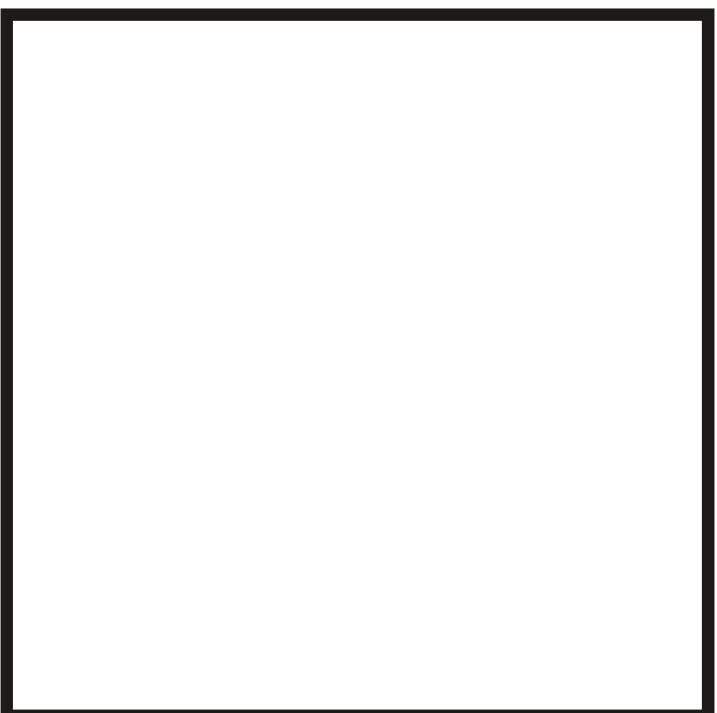
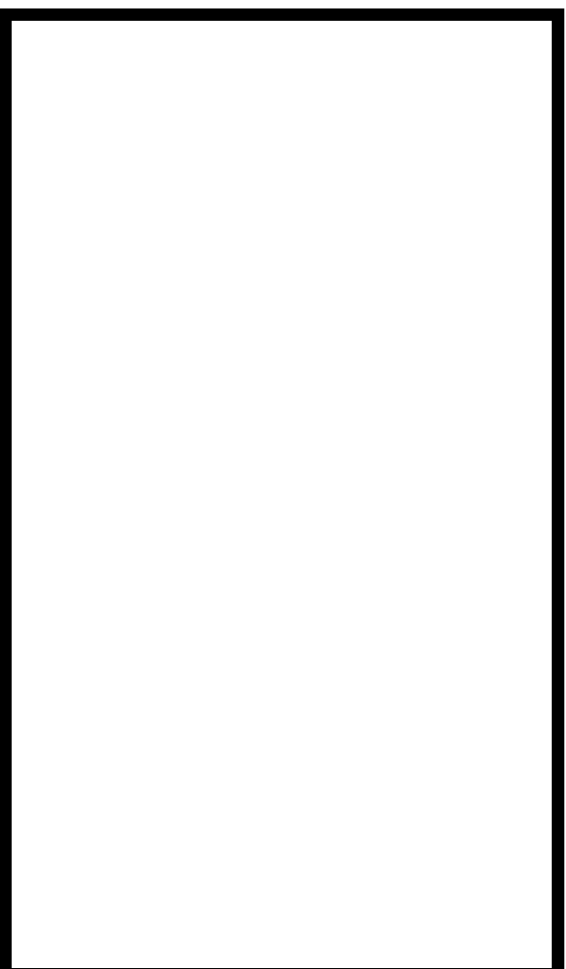
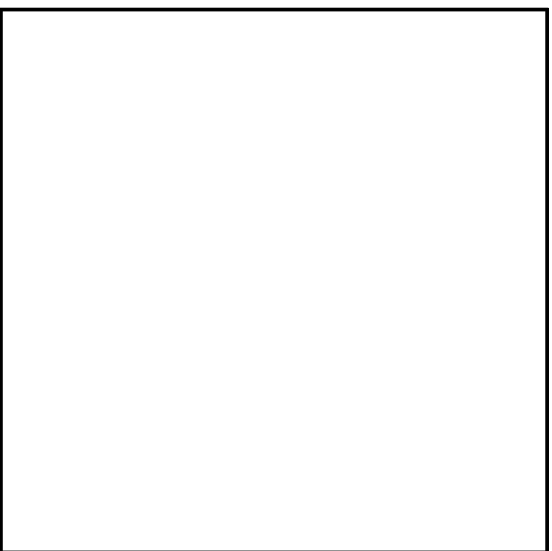
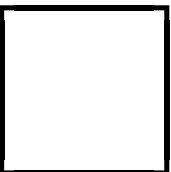
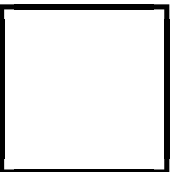
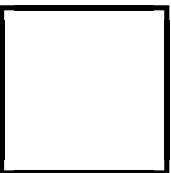
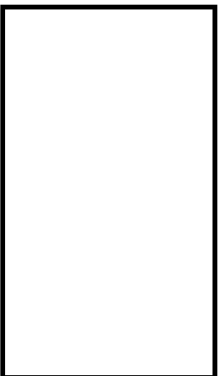
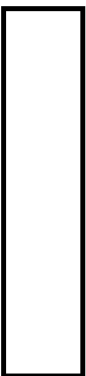
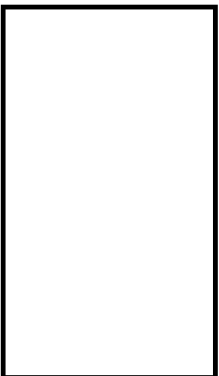


### Create
