

WHATCHA BUILDING?

As little Davey collects scrap pieces of wood for a secret project, the reader is invited to view the impacts of modernisation and consider the difference between needs and wants in a community.

Curriculum Links: HASS, Visual Arts, English, Sustainability (Cross-Curriculum Priority) Age Range: K - 6

ACTIVITY: NEEDS AND WANTS

If you could design a sustainable town what would you include? This activity will encourage students to think sustainably and consider needs and wants as they create their own town!

Listen

Read **Whatcha Building?** with your class. Spend time looking at the images/illustrations. What do students notice about the town? is there anything missing?

Discuss

As a class, **view the UN's Sustainable Development Goals**. Discuss why we have them and consider what goals connect to towns and communities. Brainstorm ways in which a town/community could meet one of the goals taking into consideration the different wants and needs of a town/community.

Create

In small groups, students **create** a 3D model including **features of a town using recycled materials.** Each group should use at least one of the UN's sustainable goals to influence what building/feature they create. *Consider the different rights that people have. How will this influence the wants and needs of the town?

<u>* For older students</u>

Students could write a proposal for their buildings to justify how their design meets any of the sustainable goals.
