



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## **EXPLORING PERSPECTIVES**







#### THERE ARE MULTIPLE PERSPECTIVES TO EVERY STORY...

Discuss and explore the importance of perspective using these outstanding picture books by Kate Temple, Jol Temple and Terri Rose Baynton.

This activity is designed to accompany either *Room on our Rock* OR *Move that Mountain*.

As a class, explore the importance of perspective by reading either book from front to back and then back to front. Focus on how language is crucial when looking at a challenge or issue from different perspectives. Following the format of the books, students will then create a story board that demonstrates two sides of a story.

Then, compare both readings. Why is it important to have two sides to a story?

What do you notice?




### **Second Reading - Back to Front**
