





David Pope *The Wave*

The wave of 'teal independents' elected to the 47th parliament swept a cavoodle-carrying Anthony Albanese and the Labor Party into government after nine long years in opposition. It was only the fourth time since the Second World War that Labor had won government from opposition.

The Greens moved an amendment to increase the target to 75 per cent, but it was defeated. Fiona Katauskas suggests that the public is starting to cotton on to Captain Carbon Cuts's alter ego.


