

Civic engagement with Aunty Fay Muir & Sue Lawson

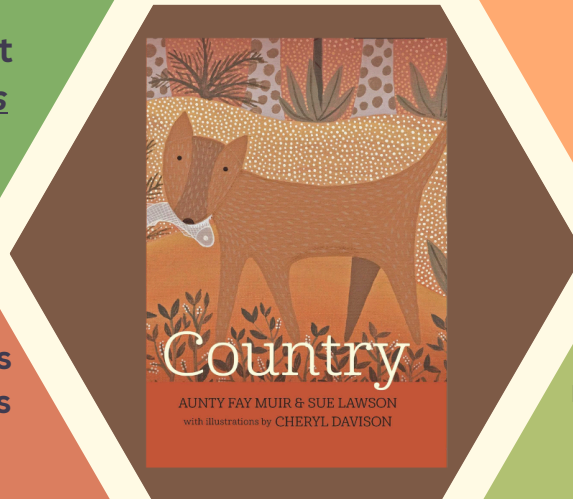


Visit Wild Dog Books for fantastic teacher notes to accompany their wide range of books.
