Teacher Notes

Our Unique Footprints and Snowprints

Activity:

- Using the accompanying activity sheet encourage students to create their own footprints or snowprints by tracing around their foot.
- The planning sheet will assist students to identify symbols, drawings and words to decorate their footprints representing their unique qualities, interests and cultural backgrounds.
- Display the footprints together to create a harmony of unique prints.

Footprint Stories

Activity:

• Once students have created their footprints, encourage them to write a short footprint story to accompany them. The story should explain the elements they have chosen to include and how they represent their unique qualities.

Footprint Gallery Walk

Activity:

- Once the footprints are displayed, invite students to participate in a Footprint Gallery Walk, encouraging them to observe each other's footprints.
- Provide students with sticky notes to write positive comments about what they notice.
- Facilitate a discussion afterward:
 - What did you learn about your classmates?
 - How did it feel to have your footprint appreciated?
 - How did it feel to appreciate other peoples footprints?
